- ✓ Increase practitioner knowledge of current initiatives or interventions related to affirmative consent

- ✓ Increase confidence and capability to build the capacity of practitioners' respective networks to implement principles of affirmative consent



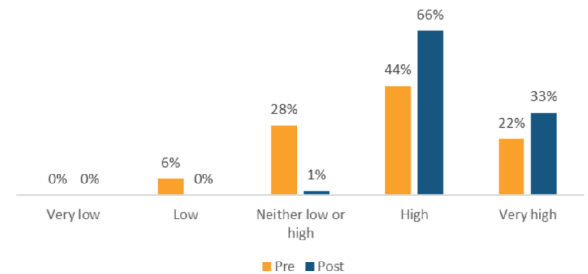
**Increased understanding of the role of affirmative consent in the primary prevention of gender-based violence (33%), with a high proportion of people selecting High to very high (99%).**



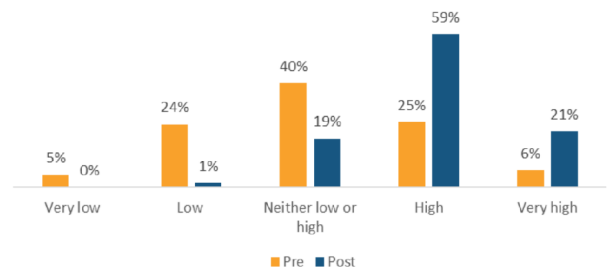
**Increased understanding of current initiatives or interventions related to affirmative consent, selecting high to very high (80%), with an overall 49% increase of understanding.**



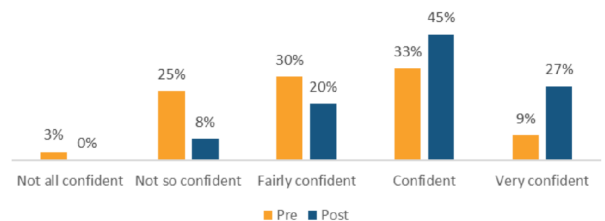
**Increase of confidence in building the capacity of a professional network to implement principles of affirmative consent in their own work (30%), with the majority of participants selecting high to very high (72%).**
